- 9. I am able to analyze problems, identify root causes, and develop effective solutions.

Using the Assessment:

- **Scoring:** Record your score (1-7) for each statement.
- Spider Chart:



- Plot your scores on a spider chart. Each statement represents a "spoke" on the chart.
 - Connecting the plotted points will create a visual profile of your entrepreneurial strengths and weaknesses.
- Reflection:
 - **High Scores (Strengths):** Think about how you can leverage these strengths in your next entrepreneurial journey.

- **Low Scores (Areas for Development):** What specific actions might you take to improve in these areas. This might include:
 - Seeking out training or workshops
 - Finding mentors or advisors
 - Gaining practical experience
 - Reading books or articles
- **Prioritization:** Prioritize 2-3 areas that, if improved, would have the most significant impact on your entrepreneurial potential.
